
SHIPPAN POINT ASSOCIATION * SPRING NEWSLETTER 2018

- · Proactively lobbied the city for increased Stamford PD patrols of Shippan.
- Sponsored 225 hours of extra police patrols during the most critical periods of the year.*

Beautification Efforts

In a continuing effort to replace the many shade trees that have perished over the last decade, the SPA has paid for the removal of close to 100 stumps and has planted over 50 trees along our roadways. In 2017, in addition to funding the placement of 13 trees, the SPA successfully applied for a neighborhood grant that financed the planting of 11 shade trees at the entrance to the Point on Shippan Avenue. These trees were planted 30 feet back from the street and behind existing (dying) old trees so that when they mature, they will not interfere with the power lines. Over 65 SPA members came together to socialize and enjoy great food and wine in a beautiful Shippan home. David and Patti Watkins hosted the 8th annual SPA Wine Tasting on Nov. 15. The tasting wines were provided by BevMax and included numerous affordable varietals from around the world. Members were able to plan ahead for their holiday wine needs and purchase the wines at a discount with profits going to the SPA Police Patrol Fund, which provides additional safety protection for Shippan.





Police Patrol Fund

While the SPA regularly requests that the City of Stamford provide police protection for our neighborhood, the reality is that City budgets are tight and we do not get the amount of proactive policing that we would like. Therefore, Shippan Point residents, through donations to the SPA Police Patrol Fund, provide for supplemental police patrols of the neighborhood. These patrols keep our neighborhood safe and protect our quality of life through enforcement of laws and ordinances regarding: loitering, speeding, parking restrictions, disturbing the peace, etc. This past year over 220 patrol hours were logged. In addition to dozens of parking violations, several arrests for narcotics and motor vehicle violations were made during SPA sponsored patrols. The suggested Patrol fund donation is \$50 per family.
